

Hopefully, I will have finished the 2008 slide show for viewing this evening.

Many thanks to Trevor and Jackie Leaton (Nick and Val's son in law and daughter) for the write up and pictures of the Traveller (649 MOR). Looks like a good effort on the car and it should provide many happy miles of motoring in the future. Thanks also to Nick and Val for providing the 'rural' Morris Minor scene on the front cover.

I finally got around to completing the underside repairs to the four door as I mentioned last month. It needed a new boot floor and this was one of the few repair panels I have not done on a saloon before. I used the car roll frame which is invaluable for working underneath. Since using it last time (when manual labour was enlisted to 'upend' the car) I used an engine crane to hoist the side upwards. For some reason, a considerable quantity must have accumulated in the rear foot-wells. I investigated afterwards, dried the carpets and fitted some new window seals (the new-type lip seals) so hopefully that will have cured

When I had the opportunity to have a little poke around the crusty edges, some additional welding jobs made themselves apparent (ahem!). Nothing too serious, you understand, just a case of tidying up - 'stitch in time' and all that. A quick blast with some underbody coating and back down on 'all fours' again. I took advantage of the fact that my son and two of his friends were round that day (utililising the garage facilities!) and we resorted to the old 'manual' method of lifting the car down onto its wheels (gently). Now I just need to refit one of the wings and paint/fit the front nearside wing and then save up for a respray. I have a bit more time on my hands at the moment between job hunting and re-decorating the house! Hopefully, I can make good use of the time to get some of those 'bottom of the list' jobs carried out.
