
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The MMOC Dorset Branch



Ex Club Van Restoration (by Brian Ford)




Jacky and I went along to see branch member Brian Ford recently. He works for a company that produces laser cut steel components for industry. His house, in Poole is a shrine to the art of laser cut metal. We were greeted by an aluminium scorpion sculpture and along the boundary wall are various decorative hanging basket brackets—all cut from steel plate. The chassis is now being

made commercially and costs about £1,600—which is quite a lot, but worth it for the right commercial project! It is believed stronger than the original and



with the option of galvanising—should last a good long time. Work on the 'ex' Dorset Branch Van was progressing nicely at the time of the visit and Brian was poised to fit the new repair piece he had just fabricated, consisting of the front chassis leg sections already joined to the front cross member (under the radiator). Sadly, there was little left of the original ones.

Whilst I was there, I had a look at Aaron's 4 door saloon (1958) which is undergoing a full restoration. It is currently sitting on (or in?) Brian's home made

chassis tilter. Another metal work marvel in itself. Brian takes up the story.

The story of the chassis is a lucky one for me, about two years ago a guy called Alex Wills called in to the firm where I work as a computer programmer for a Laser Cutting Machine, and he was asking if we could laser cut a complete chassis for a Morris Minor Van/Pick-up. He had lots of pencil drawings and rough sketches of what he wanted, all done on a long roll of lining wallpaper, he had put a lot of work and thought into the project but no idea of how to convert them to working drawings for production purposes.

So together we went through all his sketches and gradually turned them into accurate auto-cad drawings and then into a suitable file format so that our laser machine would produce what he

into a suitable file format so that our laser machine would produce what he wanted. It took many meetings and several changes in design but we got there

in the end. The chassis is an authentic copy of the original, and in my opinion better and stronger. There was a good write up in the Morris LCV Magazine. The chassis is fully welded on a jig, I am going to get mine galvanised, but I am not having it built till next spring which is why I have just built a new front section only for the old club van and I will patch up the rear section to MOT standard. I hope it will be at the Club Rally this year.



Now, I'm no expert but I wonder if this is anything to do with the rust in the old club van? (Sorry, Brian!)
