



Thank you for your enquiry about my cars.
My Morris traveller 1970 was originally ERT193J which I bought from Bury St Edmunds and now holds the registration 1098 (which is the cc of the engine). My second is a 4 door saloon 1967 which was always registered in Guernsey, now registered 43333. My third is a Morris convertible 1960, its registration is now 9333. I also have a Mini Cooper Sport year 2000. The registration is 12755 (which looks like the cc of the engine).

I am getting to the end stages of the rebuild of OLJ 147. Latest progress is a bit limited due to again a few more problems. This is something that happens when you have no source or knowledge to go by to work out how to go about things. I don't know why but it seems to click especially last thing at night whilst lying in bed going over in your mind how to overcome these glitches. So the wiring is completed and electrical components are alive. I have fitted the handbrake cables through the transmission tunnel having gone by photos of where to drill and fix the cable end attachments into the new metal flooring. I did fully restore the handbrake a while back and had the finger trigger chrome plated with the ratchet release rod. The body of the handbrake and internal ratchet I media blasted a few years ago and had them zinc plated. I also had a spare handbrake but realised on comparing both that one is for an MM and not a Series 2. I have shown these for comparison with the disassembled fittings. I have another leak on the front brakes that I identified as coming from the flexible hoses that I should have fitted new 3/8" copper washers.

The Mistletoe run from Hamworthy club to Blandford Brewery and back.


At the end a carvery was available. Great fun great food and a classic route enjoyed by all who attended. The run was open to all makes so glad many non-Morris makes turned up.

I have finished the rear seat passenger

side panel and having fitted that with the seat base, I found that the back rest would not go back upright as it is now fouling on the arm rests. I have made a drawing of dimensions that I will give to James the car trimming expert in the new year, so that he can hopefully rectify and reduce the width of the back rest. I will be fitting carpets and front seats soon so a bit more to do before Moggy Fest in May.

The 1990's arrived and NCR was used less and less but with the mileage now at well over 200000 the engine and gearbox were very worn. One day, upon leaving the local shopping centre – The Hampshire Centre – Bob pulled away in 1st gear but unfortunately couldn't find any other gears! Having driven all the way home in 1st gear Bob decided that a replacement engine and gearbox were now called for. Luckily Bob's good friend Ray knew of a recently rebuilt 803cc engine and gearbox which had been removed from an Austin A30. Despite his now advancing years Bob set about removing the old set up and successfully installing the new ones. I had met Bob and Eileen by now having moved into a bungalow just around the corner from them. I gave him the fibreglass exterior sun visor which is still fitted to the car. This is now a very rare one made by Wingard. I also gave him a Tudor washer bottle and manual pump as until this time washers had still not been fitted despite them being an MOT requirement for many years. In 1999 I bought and restored a lowlight Minor which came with a set on incorrect new red carpets. These, too, I gave to Bob as his homemade set had now worn out! Sadly, Bob died in the early

2000's but Eileen had promised him that she wouldn't sell NCR so she sat in the garage until Eileen herself passed away 7 years later and the car passed into the hands of Bobs very good friend Ray. Ray is really a Reliant Scimitar man and an 803cc Series II Minor was not his cup of tea at all so he offered the car to me in 2017 as I had also been friends with Bob and he knew I would look after it.



Ray had already got NCR up and running but she was looking rather sorry for herself by now. Still completely rust free she did require a full respray and full recommissioning. Every one of Bobs homemade "Bob-isms" was refitted to the car. I know these are not to everyone's taste but they are all an important part of NCR's history. Whilst cleaning out under the front wheelarches I found the spare front door key to Bob and Eileen's bungalow attached to a wing nut! It's still there!
